LENKER MANOR PAXTANG WOMEN'S CLUB





LIBRE'S LAW

A friendly reminder for Paxtang pet owners to help keep you and your pets happy and safe this winter.

Libre's Law (House Bill 1238), enacted in the summer of 2017, strengthened the laws in Pennsylvania protecting animals from abuse. Libre's Law defines animal abuse by grades of severity, from neglect at the low end of the scale to aggravated cruelty. Penalties for animal cruelty have been increased, ranging from 90 days in jail and a \$300 fine to seven years in jail and a \$15,000 fine.

Please note the tethering stipulations included in Libre's Law:

- Dogs tethered outside must be provided with basic needs, including water and shade.
- Dogs may not spend more than nine hours tethered in a 24-hour period. The maximum time limit is reduced to only 30 minutes when the temperature exceeds 90 degrees or is below freezing.
- A dog may not be secured with a tow or log chain or a choke, pinch, prong, or chain collar, and there may not be "excessive waste" in the tethered area.

Little Free Library and Pantry

2019 BUSINESS PRIVILEGE LICENSE

If you are conducting a business or own a rental property in the Borough of Paxtang you are required to obtain a Business Privilege License (BPL) for each business and a license for each rental property.

2019 Business Privilege Licenses will be mailed out to all current registered 2018 BPL holders. The Licenses will be printed using the current 2018 information, a form on the back of the license can be used to update, correct or to report the BPL is no longer required due to the company is no longer doing business in Paxtang, or the rental unit has been sold. The amount of the payment is included on the form, payment is due 30 days from receipt of the license. Please make sure to include your BPL number with the payment. If you have not received your BPL by January 31, 2018, Applications can be obtained by contacting the Paxtang Borough Secretary Faye Clark, at (717) 564-4770, the tax collector F. Joseph Spackman, at (717) 561-9839, or on the Paxtang Borough website www.paxtang.org/services.

MANAGING HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

The best method of managing your HHW is to prevent its generation in the first place. This involves selecting the least toxic item 'to do the job' and buying only the minimum amounts necessary. Buying in large quantities is not a bargain if half of it has to be discarded. If your materials are still usable, check with friends, neighbors, churches or other non-profit groups to see if they might be able to use it. If you are unable to donate your items, consider using Dauphin County's curbside HHW Program that is available to each household for FREE, one time per year.

THE PROGRAM IS VERY SIMPLE

STEP 1

Call 1-800-449-7587 to schedule your curbside collection.

STEP 2

In 1-2 weeks you will receive an HHW Kit in the mail for the collection of your HHW.

STEP 3

Sit your HHW kit at your curb on the scheduled collection date.

If you are unable to participate in Dauphin County's HHW Program or you have no other option but to discard the materials, you may legally dispose of them in your regular household trash pick up; provided that:

- 1. You have looked at the label for any disposal directions and have complied with them.
- Liquids that are water based have either been allowed to evaporate or non-water based liquids have been absorbed on some material such as vermiculite, cat litter, or sawdust so that there are no freestanding liquids.
- 3. The remaining residue has been carefully packaged to prevent leakage while the material is being transported to the disposal facility.
- 4. The material is placed out for disposal in small quantities, over several collection periods.

NEVER dispose of HHW in open streams, culverts or storm drains.

Notes from the Shade Tree Commission

People who live in leafy, green neighborhoods may have a lower risk of developing heart disease and strokes, according to new research published in the *Journal of the American Heart Association*. People who live in neighborhoods with more greenspaces may have better blood vessel health and lower levels of stress, and a lower risk of cardiovascular diseases such as heart attacks, strokes and others.

The trees of Paxtang give the community its character as well as making it a healthful place to live. The Borough has been a Tree City USA for close to 31 years. The Shade Tree Commission looks after the health of the trees. Jeff Shyk is the Chairperson and Jody Wood became a member in 2019. They are seeking one more person to round out the Commission. The Borough of Paxtang Shade Tree Commission inventories and maintains the Borough trees located between the public sidewalks and the curbs. This Shade Tree Lawn is maintained by the property owner of the parcel, however, the tree is Borough Property and may not be trimmed or removed by any resident. The Shade Tree Commission, Borough Public Works Department and a small group of trained and authorized volunteers, maintain over 600 trees in the borough.

Winter Weather Reminders

As the snow flies this winter, the Borough would like to remind all property owners that they must clean their sidewalks of ice and/ or snow within 24 hours after the precipitation stops. All sidewalks must be cleaned to a minimum of 3 feet in width for the safety of all who pass by. Failure to do so could result in a fine of up to \$100 plus court fees. You may want to take some time now before the bad weather hits to make arrangements with a neighbor or friends to take care of your sidewalks should you be unable to do so or if you will be out of town.

In the event of snow, Paxtang Highway employees will work to ensure the roadways are cleared. If there is a particularly large amount of snowfall, the Mayor may declare a snow emergency. During a snow emergency, there a certain parking restrictions that help our Highway employees clear the snow easier. Residents are encouraged to view the Paxtang Borough Code to see where parking is restricted. The code is available online at www.paxtang.org or a copy is available in the Borough Office. BUILDING PERMITS

State Law and Borough Ordinance requires that the property owner or their Authorized Agent (contractor) must file a building permit application for any proposed new construction, structural repairs, electrical or plumbing work.
